



## SOCIAL DISTANCING AND SANITIZATION PROTOCOL

Below are the steps we are implementing to protect the health and safety of our boaters and staff per Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines and Executive Orders of Governor Lamont.

### Our Promise to You (What we are doing):

- Frequent cleaning the dock gates and handrails
- Maintaining a clean workspace
- Social distancing of at least 6 feet whenever possible
- Wearing face coverings when social distancing cannot be maintained
- Requiring employees who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been in contact with someone who has COVID-19 to self-quarantine for a minimum of 14 days

### Your Promise to Us (What you need to do):

- Keep your distance: While we love our close-knit boating community, please remember to stay 6 feet apart from others.
- For reference, our concrete floating docks are 8' wide and I Dock is 12' wide.
- Only one person/family on each finger pier at a time.
- No guests on your boat – if they do not live with you, they should not be on your boat.
- Only one family at each picnic area at a time, clean up after yourself and wipe down the table & grill knobs (if used).
- Our staff is still here to help you with your lines, but please be mindful of your distance. Throw lines whenever possible and avoid a direct hand-off of lines or goods whenever possible.
- If you desire to provide a tip to our hard-working dock staff, please avoid a direct hand-off (leave a tip on your boat and let the staff know where to collect it later, or drop off an envelope to the marina office or hotel front desk with the staff name).
- Only staff are permitted in the Dock Office. Guests can wait in the Lighthouse Lounge (next to the Office).
- Only one family in the Lighthouse Lounge at a time, wash your hands upon your arrival and let the staff know when you leave so we can disinfect for the next guests.
- If possible, please use the head on your own boat. If you need to use the public restrooms, masks are required.
- You must wear a face covering if you cannot maintain 6 feet of social distancing, unless it would compromise your health/safety due to a medical condition. (Per Executive Order 7BB).
- You must wear a face covering at the fuel dock, or when requesting docking assistance at your slip.
- Keep your hands clean by washing them often.
- Use disinfectant on the gates when you enter/exit the dock.
- Use disinfectant upon returning dock carts to the walkway (do not leave carts on the docks).
- Keep the docks clear of debris, keep your dock lines, power cords, and hoses neatly coiled so social distancing can be safely maintained on the docks.
- Stay home if you're sick! Currently, the CDC recommends that people with an infectious illness remain at home until at least 48 hours after they are free of fever (100 degrees F or 37.8 degrees C) or signs of a fever without the use of fever-reducing medications.
